In the 20 years that BLC has existed, there was never a need for us to have a media ministry prior to the Covid-19 pandemic. We're a relatively small church, and there just wasn't a need over years.

We hope also, that by doing this, you can also keep us in prayer always, knowing what we are up to every week as a ministry. Who knows, perhaps there might be some of you who may want to join us as contributors of ideas, content or serve in this capacity.

### The Print Media - Weekly Manna


### Purpose of Existence


Upward - Worship Inward - Community Outward - Mission Forward - Learning



### History & Legacy

Rev. Sivin Kit is the original creator of the Weekly Manna. It started as an weekly Sunday handout. He designed the template, brained the contents. One of the powerful sections in the early newsletter was a section of little acts of kindness to engage new people. i.e., Speak to someone new in church (or) Bring someone new out for lunch.

One day in 2005, he said, "Let's rename it to Weekly Manna. I will write something weekly." This added an extra Reflection section. Thereafter, there were no leftover copies left on the chairs after service. Later, as his ministry responsibilities grew, we collated content from the Upper Room Daily Reflections, now known as, New Every Morning. We would fill the empty spaces with cartoons from Dave Walker of Cartoon Church - seriously funny stuff; Agnus Day, a lectionary comic, and Reverendfun- which had ended its publication on Aug 17, 2015.








Growth Through The Years

The Manna continued on with a few revisions, with the change of Pastors. We had a few issues that had beautifully drawn covers contributed by Komeil too. The most consistent cover artwork came from the moving lectionary art by artist Cerezo Barredo. The Manna issues continued, and was evolving into a downloadable digital copy via QR code till the Covid lockdowns started. Then it went into hibernation!






While chatting about the origin of the newsletter with Moh Foong- my senior who used to serve BLC in 2004, she said, "Every Saturday I will frantically look for photostating shop!!!!" That chat brought a flood of memories and laughter. All the adventures we had to get the Manna printed weekly with reasonable prices and quality, and in time, and the madness that sometimes accompanied the process for that weekend.

### Continuing Legacy, Evolving in Time

Exploring a digital layout and redesign of the Weekly Manna started with two experiential copies in November 2020. It was revived on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2021 under the new leadership. With the freshly set up Media Ministry, and having the communication work redistributed to other channels, the work could be refocused with more content. The Manna took a bigger leap in June this year with Joey Lin helming the design and layout, and increased contributions from Council and BLC Family.

Hi church, I'm Sia and I'm in charged of the Digital Media as part of the Media Ministry.

#### CHURCH: What is Digital Media all about?

Well, in simpler terms, it is creating media content, digitally. As for a slight more longer version and uninteresting way, it is CREATING media (videos, photos, slides, posters) USING either laptop, phone or tablet FROM every sources we can find, either from the internet, from the archive library (courtesy of Jorjee's work), we create our own images or your contributions (remember the previous Christmas and Easter's video). Oh, I don't work alone. It requires a lot of people to do *planning, researching, editing* and most of all, *brainstorming* for ideas! We do need help from time to time as each and everyone of us have our own day job. So if you're interested to help, please reach out to us!

### CHURCH: Sure thing! But, we're afraid we are not as creative and tech savvy as you guys, so, we might not be any help, but, we can spread the word out!

Thanks! Anyone that offers to help, Nelson can find a spot for him/her to do. We believe that our tech savvy-ness and creativities are from God, as He provides. So you don't have to be professional, just a willing heart will do. But so to speak, if you know basic video editing OR photo editing OR watched a lot of videos or contents in social media, you might be the right person here!

#### CHURCH: So, when did all of this started?

We started to do planning, video shooting and editing since 22nd March 2020, the 1st online service with LCM. Until this date, it has been 70 weeks. 70 online Sunday Service videos that consist mixture of full editing, live streaming and zoom streaming. So, yes, we do believe that God provides. Even when we thought that this pandemic gonna make things rough, stop us from meeting each other, from working with each other, from caring and loving each other. But through it all, technology and media brought us close, in different way. It's not the perfect way, but we as a community, as a church and as the followers of Christ, we did not stop and wait. We received the calling, and we marched together, digitally and faithfully.

And today, we all have no problem turning on the laptop or our mobile phones, click on the apps, either Zoom or YouTube, plug in our earphone, or some wireless earphones, and getting ready to worship with each other, singing praise, and meeting each other through the screen. We adapt. 2 years ago, such method would be a hassle, but we are glad and blessed that everyone shows their support and we do pray that we can bring God closer to all of us via technology. As this won't be going away anytime soon. So as the job. Do pray for us, the *Media Team* and every ministry in BLC!

It's Charis here. I lead BLC Social Media team.

I'm sure that most of you who are reading this, are familiar with social media and you might have seen some of our posts or announcements on WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram or TikTok! The purpose of BLC reviving our social media platforms (and adding new ones) after several years of inactiveness is so that anyone can find us anywhere. It is also a medium for us to continue staying in touch with our community whether domestically or internationally. And most importantly, to help us stay in touch with God even when we are scrolling our phones.












### SOCIAL MEDIA

I am Jorjee! I help manage BLC's browser-based platforms.




