
PRAYER of the week

The world in which we live today and about whose suffering we know so much seems more than ever a world from which Christ has withdrawn himself. How can I believe that in this world we are constantly being prepared to receive the Spirit?

Still, I think that this is exactly the message of hope. God has not withdrawn himself. He sent his Son to share our human condition and the Son sent us his Spirit to lead us into the intimacy of his divine life. It is in the midst of the chaotic suffering of humanity that the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Love, makes himself visible. But can we recognize his presence?

We live in a world where the individual is central, where each individual sees himself as the point of reference for almost all experiences. When the individual is being detached from Community, it will slowly lean towards an isolated perception of the 'self'. The Scripture often reminds us of the necessary balance of the individual and the Community – both are necessary. Dietrich Bonhoeffer expressed this crucial balance most succinctly,

"Let him who cannot be alone beware of community...
Let him who is not in community beware of being alone...
Each by itself has profound pitfalls and perils.
One who wants fellowship without solitude
plunges into the void of words and feelings,
and one who seeks solitude without fellowship
perishes in the abyss of
vanity, self-infatuation, and despair."

The 'Communion of saints' is both an overarching idea that brings all believers, past, present and future together as the Bride of Christ but this would not be possible without genuine authentic relationships between individuals.

Genuine authentic relationships between individuals entails a certain level of commitment and solidarity. Joining a church as a member is not merely an administrative matter but more importantly, it is an external decision that expresses an internal commitment to Community – a commitment to live together with each other in particular in the presence of God.

Jesus gave us only one new commandment, “to love one another as I have loved you.” That commandment can only be fulfilled in Community. It is not an abstract idea as in, ‘I love humankind,’ but in loving a real person as who he is and being loved in return as who I am. The reason for this commandment? “So that the world may know that you are my disciples.” In other words, we don't just tell the world about Christ, we show them who Christ is in Community.

23 Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, 25 not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. (Hebrews 10)

We welcomed *Anne Fowles*, *Calvin Woo* and *Melanie Yong* formally into our Community in Bangsar Lutheran Church on 1st August 2021. What is one experience you had with the Lord that inspired you?






What do you do during your free time?






